A Word from Dr. Herman about HNH's Work in Honduras

Honduras is the 2nd poorest country in Latin America with an estimated population of 9.75 million (2019). According to the Archives of Medicine (2017) 9 out of 10 people aren't covered by any kind of health insurance and more than 1.5 million don't have access to health services. The hospitals and health clinics are deficient; some clinic buildings date from the last century. The public health service in Honduras has 9.5 beds available for every 10,000 inhabitants.

Even though all of this makes receiving good healthcare in Honduras difficult, the government corruption and political crisis that has existed over the last 2 decades makes the situation worse. This affects the country's poorest population the most. According to the World Food Program and CDC, 67.5% of the population in the rural areas of the county live in poverty and 1 in 4 children suffer chronic malnutrition. Chronic malnutrition in some areas of Honduras is high as 48.5%.

What is the role of Healthy Niños Honduras?

HNH plays a very important role as a nonprofit organization in Honduras, providing more than 15,000 medical consultations and dental services in remote areas where medical services aren't available. Every year HNH distributes free medicines and supplies and more than 700 children with chronic malnutrition are discovered. HNH has improved many houses through the concrete floors and the clean water options that are given to the families.

In addition, HNH continues to provide education to communities and its families in regards to clean water, preventing malnutrition, fortifying foods with vitamins, and helping children survive and thrive!

HNH is doing all of this with the support of many volunteers that generously donate money and time to continue sharing the blessings with the children and families in need!

Sending a Container of Donations to Honduras

Every year we set a goal to send a 40 ft shipping container to Honduras full of donations. It is a costly process, costing about \$10,000 in global expenses (shipping and customs included) and can be labor intensive, lifting and moving many boxes. But when we see the way the donations help so many people in Honduras we are encouraged to do it again.

Bringing Quality Dental Care to More People

For years Honduran dentists have been traveling with the mission teams to the communities to help with dental care. Unfortunately, when a commmunity is in poor health, they often have poor dental hygiene as well. Most of the time the dentist was completing extractions as the person's teeth were not salvagable.

Recently HNH was gifted funds to purchase two portable dental units. Now when the mission teams travel to the communities, the dentist can fill cavities and complete dental cleanings even when there is no electricity or running water. See the picture to the right as a demonstration of the procedures we can now complete. We are grateful to give the chance for many to smile again!

Checking Hemoglobin Levels

The mission teams participate in several stations while visiting the communities in Honduras. The communities members pass through the stations to get their deworming pills, vitamins, have their blood pressure checked and have the children weighed and measured to check if they are malnourished. In addition we check hemoglobin levels with a simple finger prick. However the system we were using can sometimes be difficult.

HNH was recently gifted with funds to purchase a portable, automatic hemoglobin test meter. We can quickly assess the patient and treat them for anemia if necessary. We plan to purchase more as we are able, to use in the communities.



Serving Others Because God Has Blessed Us.

I met the Benners when Dave & I were ministry partners in church planting in East Greenville in 1991. During those years, I learned about the work of MAMA Project and grew to appreciate what was being done for the people of Honduras.

I began working as the accounting volunteer around 2002, assisting with accounts payable, financials statements and reporting.

I have enjoyed working with Dr. Herman Sagastume since he began his work with MAMA and now Healthy Niños. My wife and I believe in serving others, because God has blessed us so much. The Bible calls us to respond to the needs of others. Over time I have come to appreciate

and love the people of Honduras and want to assist them where I am able.

It has been my privilege to take four service trips to Honduras and see the staff I am working with and some people in villages we are helping. A side benefit is being able to eat some really ripe and juicy mangoes. I could also see pineapples and coffee being grown.

In light of my past interest and work, it seemed natural to join the Healthy Niños Honduras group to continue blessing people in Honduras.
