
and painful memories. I thought, "I'm going away and will never return."

The Cycle of Stunting

This graphic produced by Concern USA, shows the cycle that Healthy Niños Honduras is working to break in families.

Stunting not only means that the child physically will not reach their maximum height, but stunting has also has been shown to cause four times the likelihood to die in childhood, reduce IQ, and less lifetime income.

What Causes Stunting?

There are many factors that can cause stunting including lack of food or lack of nutritious food for long periods of time, poor drinking water, how a child is cared for, and proper health care.

Can Stunting be Reversed?

The most important time is during the first 1,000 days of life (conception to age 2), but helping a child after that time period has also proven to be successful.

What is Healthy Niños Honduras Doing to Prevent Stunting?

The Nutrition Center includes educational times where mothers can learn about healthy hygiene and other habits that can break this cycle. HNH also has community trainings in addition to providing medical brigades to 60-80 poor, rural villages. By continuing to educate and bring resources to these villages, HNH hopes to break the cycle of stunting and eradicate malnutrition!

A Hope for a Better Future

Olga and her four children came to the Nutrition Center. As most mothers are, they come nervous about the unexpected. Will they fit in with the other families? Will they feel welcomed? Is the time at the Nutrition Center really going to be worth it? Will they leave with anything more than what they came with?

Her family is pictured right: Delia (age 12), David (age 8), husband, José Antonio, Olga, Lastenia (age 6), and José Antonio (age 14).

After one month at the Nutrition Center, they could see the improvements their children were making. Each

Sunday, the families can invite loved ones to visit and the fathers usually take advantage of this day to see how their children have grown.

José Antonio shares about how much he loves working on his home farm. He tells Karin, the Healthy Niños Director, "I want to share a portion of my harvest because I'm so grateful for all of you. I will give you some plantains and some yuca. I have also brought some chayote (similar to a summer squash), so that we can plant some here for the families. I have seen my children enjoying their time here. I am very grateful for you and ask that God can continue blessing the work that you are doing. I would like to help with the little that I can. I send a blessing to those that help the Nutrition Center, that touch each of our hearts."

Later in the afternoon, the mothers and families at the Nutrition Center went down to the garden to plant the donated chayotes. As part of the program, the families learn about planting and harvesting their own healthy food and the chayote is a welcome addition.

After working in the garden, the mothers and children walk cheerfully back to their home away from home, the Nutrition Center. Our continued prayer is that we can help each of the children that come to the Center; to allow them to return to their homes in better health, strength, and knowing that there are many who care for them, including Jesus!
