## Hunger: A Consequence of COVID-19

The consequences of the coronavirus pandemic may prove more devastating than the disease itself for the world's poorest countries as the global economy hurtles into recession, people lose jobs by the hundreds of millions and the risk of hunger grows, U.N. officials and aid experts fear.

Some 1.6 billion of the world's 2 billion informal workers, or nearly half the global workforce, have already lost their jobs, according to the International Labor Organization. They include gig workers in Western economies, but the vast majority are in developing countries, where most employment is informal and families live hand-to-mouth, relying on a daily wage if they are to eat at the end of the day.

The loss of income for people already living perilously close to the margins of survival will propel up to 50 million people into abject poverty this year, reversing three decades of gains in the war against deprivation, according to World Bank estimates. A study by the United Nations said 580 million could become impoverished, meaning they lack the basic means to survive.

And as incomes are lost, a "hunger pandemic" could eclipse the coronavirus, the World Food Program has warned; 130 million people are expected to join the ranks of the 135 million who were expected to suffer from acute hunger this year, the agency says, bringing to 265 million the number of those at risk of starvation.

## Healthy Niños provides food to many families!

Healthy Niños has responded to the need for food in the most vulnerable areas of Honduras. With your \$40 donation, we were able to purchase food for a family for two weeks. The families that received the assistance were very grateful. We will continue to supply food to families as long as we have the funds to do so and the need continues.

Many families in the countryside of Honduras live in simple homes, like the one pictured to the right. They rely on being able to work and purchase their food daily. While the country is on lockdown during COVID, the people are unable to go to work and therefore are unable to provide any food for themselves.

Healthy Niños food packages include the basic staples: vegetables, rice, beans, corn, sugar, powdered milk, and pasta.



Yosidia, pictured left, lives with her partner and two 2 children in San Fracisco de Yojoa, the same town as the Nutrition Center.

After receiving the food donation, Yosidia expressed that she did not expect it. Unfortunately other organizations may promise gifts to people but never provide the gift. She was shocked to receive the food in her arms and was shocked at the amount of food provided. When she was in her kitchen and

saw what the donation bag contained, she started to cry as not long before she had been praying to God to provide.

After receiving her donation, Yosidia had been talking to her neighbor Rebecca, pictured right with her daughter. Rebecca mentioned that she had nothing in her kitchen. Yosidia told her to trust God, that God was going to provide for her as well. A few minutes later, Healthy Niños came to Rebecca's house, giving her a food donation. When Rebecca started to take out the donation and put it on

her kitchen table, she also cried. Rebecca called her mother who lives approximately 10 hours away. She expressed how much she would have liked her to be close so that she could share with her what she received.
